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About the Instructors:



Joe Collins, Shelby NC

A National Champion mountain dulcimer player, Joe began playing the mountain dulcimer in the late 70s in coffeehouses, churches, and schools. He has written several books of dulcimer music, produced CDs, and has performed across the country in a number of different venues. In September of 2007, he won the title of National Champion at Winfield, KS. Joe loves working with and performing for people. His twelve books of dulcimer tablature grew out of a desire to teach others to play. He is a popular mountain dulcimer clinician at festivals, offering clear instruction

supplemented by easy-to-follow instructional material. He is a songwriter, vocalist, and an occasional guitarist. His performances are sprinkled with a lot of humor and some excellent mountain dulcimer playing - sure to bring a smile to audiences of all ages. Joe has a Doctorate in Adult Education. He has worked in Religious Education for most of his professional career and now serves as Associate Professor of Religion at Gardner-Webb University in Boiling Springs, NC. Don Pedi, Marshall, NC

Don started playing dulcimer in 1968. He developed fingering and strumming methods to match the fiddle note for note while maintaining the appropriate speed and rhythms of traditional tunes. Don learned a great many songs and tunes directly from older-generation musicians. Between 1974 and 1984 Don was presented with over forty firstplace ribbons and trophies. He has been honored for the

preservation, perpetuation, and performance of Traditional Appalachian Music Since 1985 Don championed Folk and Eclectic music serving as an On-air host. His weekly show "Close to Home" can be heard streaming and "live" on NPR affiliate WNCW 88.7 out of Spindale, NC. Don appears in the movies "The Songcatcher" and "The Journey of August King. "

Please consider your skill level when choosing a class. The instructors will be teaching at the level listed in the description. We make this request because instructors cannot meet the needs of their students if there is a wide range of abilities in the class.

SKILL LEVEL DEFINITIONS:

Beginner

The student may have never touched a dulcimer prior to class and need not have any musical background. The Beginner student may also have recently begun playing but want to be sure they are using good form and to be clear on their basic skills before continuing. Instruction will include how to hold the instrument, how to tune it, how strum a steady rhythm, play back up chords and play several tunes.

Advanced Beginner

The student knows how to tune the dulcimer using an electronic tuner, hold a pick and strum, although may need help in keeping a steady rhythm or in using more complex rhythms. The student should be able to quickly find frets 0 through 7 and should be able to play several tunes.

Intermediate

The student should be able to use several strum patterns, be able to play two and three finger basic chords for the key of D, be able to follow tablature at a basic level and be familiar with the fretboard beyond the 7th fret

Morning classes CHOOSE ONE

1) **Beginners** This class continues all day. (Do not sign up for other classes if you sign up for Beginners.) Which side of the dulcimer is up? How do you tune it? It's easy. You'll be playing tunes in no time. You won't leave without information on how you can continue to play after the workshop. You do not need a musical background or to be able to read music. You may also wish to take this class if you have started to learn the dulcimer but want to be sure that you have the basics right. Skills which will be taught include how to: hold the instrument in your lap, hold a pick, do a basic "Bum-dit-ty" strum, an easy way to finger the basic chords needed to play most dulcimer tunes and get a start on learning tunes for your repertoire. This is a wonderful opportunity to see if you are really interested in playing a dulcimer without investing in an instrument. 2) Advanced Beginners Smooth out your strumming and get that rhythm right! After learning to play easy melodies, students at the advanced beginner level often need some help keeping an even rhythm and feeling comfortable with their strumming. This class covers rhythms used in fiddle tunes, as well as other rhythms used in waltzes or hymns/gospel music. Depending on the needs of the students, this class may also cover other advanced beginner techniques, such as using more than one finger on the left hand, using basic chords and reading basic musical notation. 3) Driving Your Dulcimer Like You Mean It! Participants should be comfortable with strumming in both directions, have a decent sense of timing, and be able to play several tunes without having to be totally dependent on tablature.) The difference between good dulcimer players and great ones is usually found in what they do with the picking/ strumming hand. The goal of this workshop is for you to develop skill and proficiency with that hand. We will try out patterns that you can begin incorporating into your playing immediately, but we will also work on exercises that you can continue doing long after the workshop is over. 4) History of the Dulcimer

A history of the dulcimer, utilizing a video, antique, vintage, and modern instruments to demonstrate the evolution of the dulcimer and how they are played. Don Pedi, Instructor. ALL LEVELS

5) Intro to Jamming 101 Want to join the jam but don't feel comfortable? Maybe you don't know what is expected of you in a jam or don't know many tunes? This class will give you confidence to feel more comfortable joining (I don't think anyone really feels comfortable in a jam until they have attended several). We will go over how to know what chords you need to know, listening for chord changes and jam etiquette. Then we will learn a few jam tunes and have our own jam. If we are lucky, we will find a guitarist

and learn how to cheat off of the guitar. BRING A CAPO IF YOU HAVE ONE. Nancy Galambush, Instructor, ADVANCED BEGINNER AND UP.

CHOOSE TWO AFTERNOON CLASSES

Afternoon Classes <u>Session 1 - Choose 1</u>

6) Funny Songs for Your Repertoire Kick back and have some fun in this workshop. We'll be playing and singing a variety of songs to tickle your funny bone! We'll also learn how to use the dulcimer to accompany ourselves as we help people laugh. Joe Collins, Instructor, ALL LEVELS.

7) Ballads and Sacred Songs Join in to play and/or sing along with these traditional songs, mostly from the Southern Appalachians. Authentic versions of Ballads or as they are called "Old Love Songs" as well as some Old-Time Sacred Songs. Don Pedi, Instructor. ADVANCED BEGINNER THROUGH INTERMEDIATE.

8) Celtic Session Tunes. Be ready to call a few tunes at your next Celtic/Irish Session (jam). Due to the Scots-Irish history of the Appalachian Mountains, many of these tunes are played in Old Time jams too. Nancy Galambush, Instructor, INTERMEDIATE AND UP.

Afternoon classes Session 2 - Choose 1

9) Minor Hymns A repertoire workshop of haunting melodies applied to hymns. We'll be focusing on hymn melodies written in minor keys. Joe Collins, Instructor, ADVANCED BEGINNER AND UP.

10) Old-Time Songs and Fiddle Tunes for Dulcimer Suggested playing techniques applied to traditional songs and tunes, mostly from Western North Carolina and southeastern Kentucky. Don Pedi, Instructor, INTERMEDIATE.

11) What Women Want. So many songs about men! Old Joe Clark, even Lil' Liza Jane and Angelina Baker are sung from a man's point of view. Men working, men sailing the seas, men lusting after women, men killing women. Where are the songs from a woman's point of view? Come and look at the world of Old Time songs from a woman's point of view. Nancy Galambush, Instructor. INTERMEDIATE AND UP
