Counting in can be a little tricky on this one because of the weird timing signature. Until you get use to the intro, you may want to count it as if it were 4/4 time. You'll count to 4 seven times, count 1 and start on 2.

In the accompaniment track, there is a flute that takes the melody part on the third verse. You can play backup chords during that time, or you can play the melody along with the flute.
